At Teatown Natural Science Summer Day Camp, kids learn through exploration and creative play, develop a sense of place in the natural world, and grow respect for each other and all living things.

Find your camp

DISCOVERERS: GRADES PRE-K-K
Pre-K (half day) & Kindergarten (full day)

Campers sprout in nature through hikes, hands-on discoveries, and storytelling. Sensory activities include investigation of what lives beneath the soil and in the water. Be prepared for muddy hands and wet feet! Campers also experience their first encounters with Teatown's animal ambassadors.

TREKKERS: GRADES 1-2

Daily exploration of forests, fields, and streams lead campers farther out on Teatown trails. Engage in up-close interactions with the natural community — like frogs, salamanders, and insects. Curiosity is nurtured through mini-experiments, inquiry, and nature play.

BUSHMASTERS: GRADES 3-4

The spirit of discovery kicks into high gear for 8- and 9-year-olds. Campers learn about the delicate balance in the great web of life by exploring, playing games, and participating in mini-projects on sustainability, habitats, food webs, and wildlife stewardship.

NATURE GIRLS AT CLIFFDALE: GRADES 3–7 (Sessions I & II)

Engage in activities designed to inspire leadership, teamwork, and self-discovery. Explore ways Nature Girls of the past have paved the way for Nature Girls of the present and future.





EARTH STEWARDS IN THE LAB: GRADES 3-7 (Sessions III and IV)

Take the Teatown camp experience and knowledge and apply it to exciting hands-on projects. Contribute to international and regional citizen science research and learn fun and easy field research techniques at Teatown's Science Center Lab and Cliffdale Farm.

JUNIOR NATURALISTS: GRADES 5-7

Embark on investigations to learn about our region's biodiversity. Trek and explore new destinations along managed trails to adjacent county parks. Use technology to navigate and to practice conservation methods.

EXPLORERS: GRADES 8-9

Build confidence on challenging and vigorous terrain beyond Teatown's boundaries. Learn about current environmental issues while exploring local ecosystems including rocky mountaintops, salt and freshwater marshes, and the Hudson River. Engage in stewardship projects at Teatown.

COUNSELORS-IN-TRAINING: AGE 15+

CITs assist counselors in games, crafts, and exploration with campers. They serve as role models for young campers and develop leadership and responsibility.
